### Message of the week:

### Issues the team will focus on:

#### **We're working hard to create jobs and opportunities:**

- Two and a half years ago, we inherited a budget in deficit and a debt rising to \$80 billion. The budget uncertainty and lack of economic activity impacted business and consumer confidence, hurting Queensland jobs.
- We've worked hard to stop the unsustainable growth in debt, and next year the budget will be in surplus for the first time in a decade.

#### **If asked – Independent Remuneration Tribunal's report into MPs' allowances**

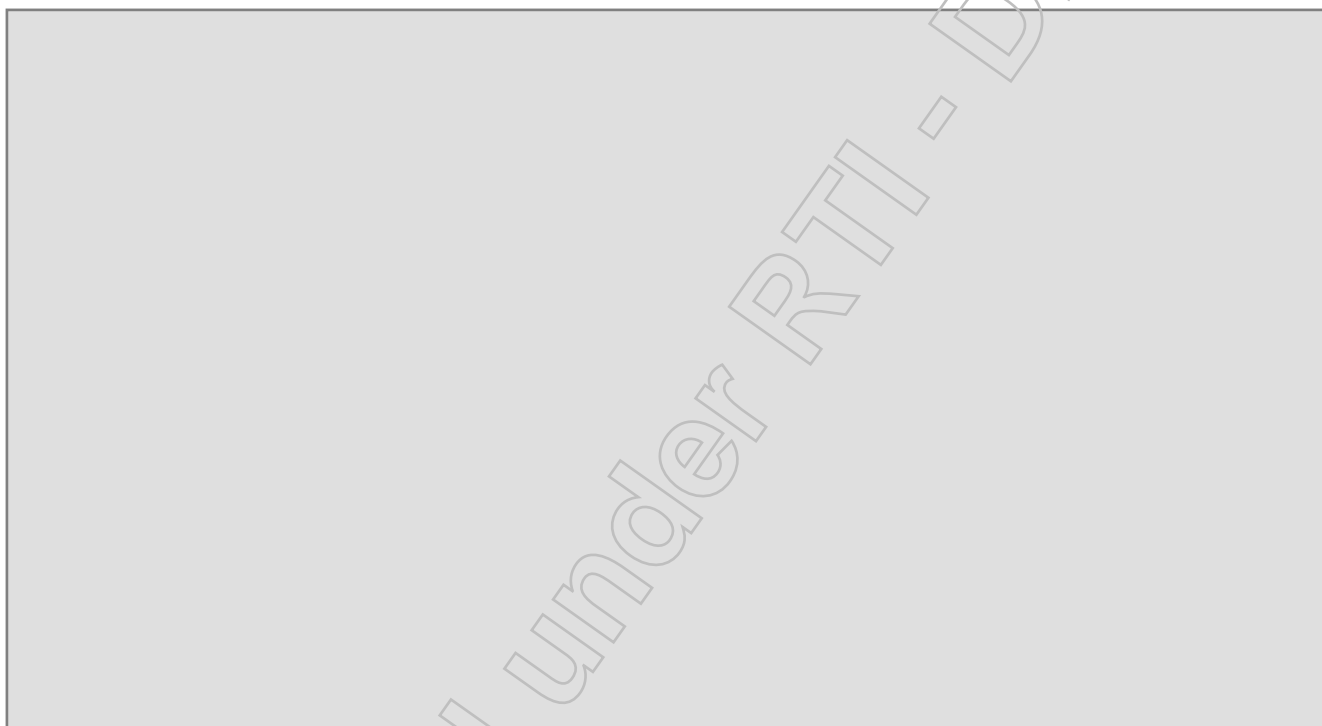
- That's entirely a matter for the Independent Remuneration Tribunal.

#### **If asked – Asbestos concerns from old factories**

#### **If asked – Federation review and GST**

- We support a review of the Federation as we need to clearly define which level of government delivers which services.
- There are far too many areas where federal and state responsibilities overlap and create waste, duplication and confusion.
- States must have untied access to a sustainable revenue base that is sufficient to fund the hospitals, schools and other services people expect.
- However, we don't support an increase in the GST. The debate about Federation reform should be about responsibilities not taxes.

#### **If asked – Dredging at Abbot Point**

- The Queensland Government's plan will ensure dredge material produced at Abbot Point will be re-used on land rather than disposed of at sea.
- Our plan is a win for jobs and a win for the environment. It will protect the Great Barrier Reef while still allowing for the development of an important port and the Galilee Basin coal projects.
- Under the former Labor Government, port development was not constrained at all and dredging for Abbot Point was proposed to be 38 million cubic metres– more than 12 times the three million cubic metres we have allowed.
- We welcome Labor's bi-partisan support for our plan.

### **If asked – Raised terrorism alert**

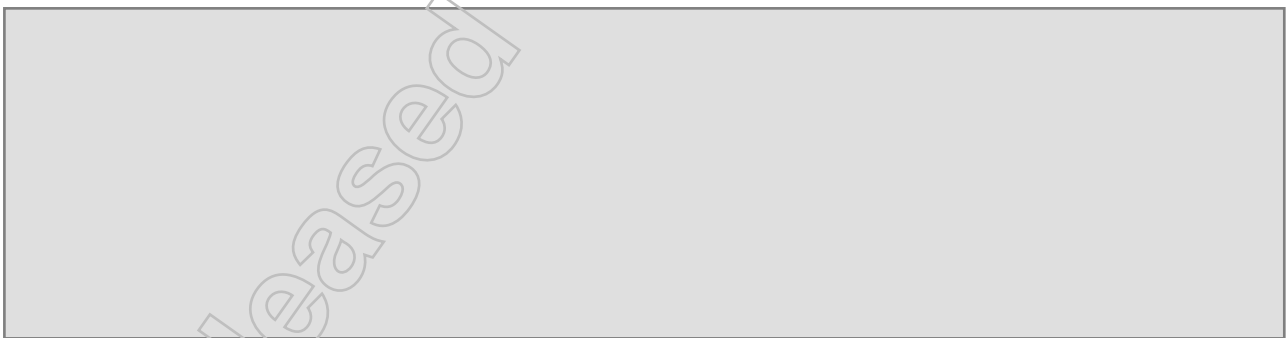

Dear Minister Langbroek

As you are aware, there are a number of arrivals scheduled into Brisbane next week in preparation for the G20 Leaders Summit on 15 and 16 November.

You will also have been advised by now that you have been rostered to represent the Queensland Government at the official arrival of the Leaders from Brazil and France.

Accompanying this letter are some documents that will provide you with information about the recommended route to the G20 arrival terminal, precinct access and parking arrangements, and your relevant airport liaison officer contact who will meet you and escort you through the entire process.

There are likely to be delays getting to the airport precinct as Leader motorcade movements commence. I would recommend allowing additional travel time to the airport to ensure you are not delayed, and suggest using the Queensland Government Air Wing as a base if required.

**AIRPORT GREETING WITH G20 LEADER:** Attached is a list of the airport meet and greet roster for all state aircraft (G20 Terminal) and regular passenger terminal (Regular International Terminal) arrivals for G20.

**PURPOSE:** To meet and welcome G20 Leaders to Queensland on behalf of the Queensland Government

**FLIGHT ARRIVAL TIME:** Flight arrival times are contained within the attached roster. You should arrive at either terminal not later than 30 minutes prior to the scheduled aircraft arrival.

It would be wise to allow plenty of time to travel to the airport as there will most likely be delays due to road closures for motorcade movements.

The State Government Air Wing could be utilised as a "waiting area" given its close proximity to the G20 terminal and a route which is least impacted by potential road closures.

**DEPARTURE TIME:** Once Leaders have arrived and are greeted, they will depart by official motorcade.

Following their departure you will be escorted from the terminal by your Commonwealth G20 Taskforce Airport Liaison officer.

**LOCATION OF MEETING:** Depending on which Leader you are welcoming, refer to the attached roster, you could be meeting at either the G20 Terminal or Regular International Terminal

For arrivals at the regular international terminal, normal access arrangements apply – arrival would be at level 2.

**ACCREDITATION** You must carry your accreditation, as well as a secondary form of photo identification, with you at all times. No accreditation no entry.

(Accreditation will be delivered to your office in coming days)

**ON ARRIVAL:** Once you have reached the VIP car park or regular international terminal, you should make contact with your Airport Liaison Officer who will meet and escort you through the arrival process.

Name and contact details of your Airport Liaison Officer are to be provided



**PARKING:**

The attached map provides details of parking arrangement at the G20 terminal

No special arrangements have been made for parking of vehicles at the regular international terminal. Regular parking arrangements will apply.

**OTHER AIRPORT WELCOME ATTENDEES:**

The attached roster provides the name of the Commonwealth Official who will meet and welcome Leaders.

There may also be other Australian based officials like Ambassadors, High Commissioners or Consular Officials present as well.

**DRESS:**

Business attire

**SUGGESTED WELCOME SENTENCE/STATEMENT:**

Your opportunity to converse with the Leader as they disembark will be very limited.

When you meet your Leader you should address them as per the attached 'Guide to Forms of Address'

It is recommended you use the following sentence as a guide for a possible welcome greeting.

"Good morning/afternoon/evening Your Royal Highness/Your Excellency/President/Prime Minister/Chancellor. Welcome to Queensland. It is an honour to have you visit our State. I hope the Leaders' Summit is beneficial and productive and you get have the opportunity to experience a little of our hospitality."

**MEDIA IN ATTENDANCE:**

Yes – there are specific media platforms and viewing locations at the airport to cover all VIP arrivals

**NOTES/OTHER:**

Updates on aircraft arrival times or delays will be conveyed as received.

Airport Liaison Officer details are not yet available and will be conveyed as soon as available.

Only accredited officials will be permitted entry to the airport precinct.

A list of key emergency contact names and numbers will be provided in the event of any queries or concerns.

## ROUTE DIRECTIONS – G20 TERMINAL VIP PARKING

### Driving Directions

In order to avoid potential road closures the most convenient access to the G20 Terminal precinct will be from Kingsford Smith Drive. From Kingsford Smith Drive turn left onto Sugarmill Road and continue north, proceed straight through the roundabout at Lomandra Drive and onto Boronia Road.

You may be required to show your photo ID at this Check Point. Once approved by security, you will be directed to the parking zone indicated on the map below off Da Vinci Boulevard.

Turn left into Leonardo Drive and left again at Da Vinci Boulevard and then right into the driveway just before the road closure.

Proceed through the buildings to the western side of the precinct and into the VIP parking area at car park 1.
