### Ministerial Statement

#### Proposed desired Level of Service discussion paper

South East Queensland (SEQ) residents and businesses are still paying a high price for the failure of successive Queensland Governments to plan, build and manage the region's water supply. We should never forget SEQ was on the brink of running out of water just a few years ago. There are countless stories of the hardship SEQ residents and businesses faced during the water supply crisis, as well as the ongoing cost-of-living stress that is directly linked to paying for some of Australia's most expensive, now unnecessary, bulk water assets.

Because water supplies are near full, now is the right time for Seqwater (the owner of the bulk water supply infrastructure) to start planning to ensure water supplies can meet our regional demands well into the future.

Governments that fail to plan for today also fail the generations of Queenslanders that follow. We must be proactive in our approach to planning.

The desired level of service objectives are a management tool that will help ensure future governments are not forced into making panicked, highest-cost, crisis management decisions.

The review of the desired level of service objectives considers options that will enable a more flexible, adaptive and cost-effective management approach for our region's water supply.

While the objectives set the 'minimum' level of security, Seqwater will be responsible for planning the delivery of the desired level of service. These plans, which will be outlined in the South East Queensland water security program, will also reduce red tape.

The desired level of service objectives will guide Seqwater's planning processes so that we have adequate water supplies to meet the region's demands over the long term, and that our basic water needs can be met under all circumstances, including severe droughts.

We encourage you to read this discussion paper and have your say on our proactive approach to providing a more secure and affordable water supply for future SEQ residents and businesses.

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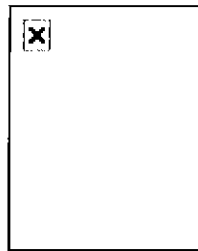

**REPORTER:**

The changes to the CMC. More money, more power?

**PREMIER:**

Well, it's not really a case of more power, actually. Just to clarify, what we're doing here is, firstly, giving them more resources. Up to \$7 million so that they can better go after organised criminal gangs. The other thing that we're doing is making it more likely that the police will be able to refer gang members to the CMC. We're trying to make sure that when the Police Commissioner and his team think that someone should be referred for interrogation, essentially, through their processes that this can happen. We're not changing the powers of the CMC *per se* to then go after these people, to question them, to get them to reveal their criminal links and their ill-gotten gains. So, that's what's actually happening here.

**REPORTER:**

How does it fit in with the review of the CMC? Any plans there?

**PREMIER:**

Well, many people have quite falsely speculated that in some way we were going to dismember the CMC or take away their ability to fight crime or misconduct. This, I think, just demonstrates that that was wrong. That was totally incorrect. This funding will allow them to bolster their major crime fighting efforts and ensures that they have the resources to do that job.

**REPORTER:**

[Inaudible] Why would the bikies cooperate?

**PREMIER:**

Well, that's the... Perhaps I should just explain the way this works. And I just want to stress to Queenslanders again, there is no change to the way the CMC will actually operate internally. Okay? The powers of the CMC have are these Star Chamber powers, were put in place by governments prior to mine and they are not changing one little bit. I want to make that very,

very clear. Yes, we're making change that allows the police to get people down there to be questioned. But they should be because they're members of criminal organisations. So, that's the change there that is pertinent. The way this is going to work is that the police will be referring criminal motorcycle gang members to the CMC for investigation. The CMC will, in their hearings, using their existing powers, be able to ask them all sorts of questions about their associates, about their activities, about their ill-gotten gains.

**REPORTER:**

If they refuse to provide them?

**PREMIER:**

If they refuse to answer, and this is the point, if they refuse to answer, they can go to jail for contempt of court. Frankly, I don't care how these people go to jail. If they won't cooperate, if they won't tell the truth, then they should go to jail anyway. And if we can then get information that sends them to jail for the real crimes they've committed, so much the better.

**REPORTER:**

Is that sentence, in that instance; is that an indefinite sentence until such time as they do speak?

**PREMIER:**

Well, my understanding is at the moment, that a person who goes into the CMC who refuses to answer questions during those hearings could receive a penalty of three to six months in jail. And obviously they then get released, but I can assure those criminal motorcycle gang members, you will be pursued. The CMC will then have you back and ask you the same questions. If you don't answer those questions, then you will be up for contempt again and you'll probably go back to jail. Again, I don't mind how these people go to jail, but I want to see them behind bars and so do all Queensland citizens.

**REPORTER:**

Have you got all of these laws ready to go for next week, now?

**PREMIER:**

Well, there is a suite of laws that will be going through the Parliament. There will be a first tranche next week and I say to you there will probably be other laws that will be coming through as well. Probably a second tranche from two to three weeks later. But, I've said already, we know that some of these things will be challenged. We know that some may be overturned. Doesn't matter. We're going to continue to try again. There are many mechanisms that we're going to use and I just say to them it's time to get a real job. It's time to know that it's now over. The party's over. The game's over. We're going to actually go after you in a way that nobody ever has before. We've only just started.

**REPORTER:**

Just finally, any further word on the greater police powers that we'll see in the laws?

**PREMIER:**

Well, there will be mechanisms there to assist the Queensland police, okay? There will be mechanisms to assist them to do the job they need to do. One of them is to ensure that we can get these criminal gang members down to the CMC so they can be interviewed there in these hearings. That is a very important part of this and again I stress there's no change to the CMC's powers.

**REPORTER:**

Are you concerned about this recall of electrical wiring that's meant to be very prevalent throughout Queensland?

**PREMIER:**

Look, I am concerned and I haven't had a chance yet to talk to my team about that. But, I will be very clearly after the maximum possible action from Queensland government agencies to protect the public.

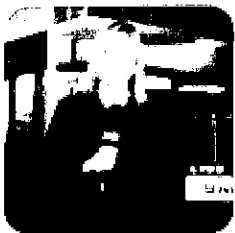

**Ms PALASZCZUK:** (2.32 pm): My question is to the Premier. Does the Premier support the principle of the independence of the judiciary in Queensland?

**Mr NEWMAN:** I definitely do. I would like to talk about the matter in a bit more broader context this afternoon because I think it is important that some of the things that I have said are put on the record in this place. At the LGAQ conference on 23 October I said this—

We as a government we do everything we can to protect Queenslanders from criminal thugs, from paedophiles and sex offenders. What we need now is for the judiciary, those who run the court system, the insiders, to actually realise that's what Queenslanders want as well and they need to have a look at how they're operating and make sure they protect Queenslanders.

Subsequently in an interview with 4BC on 24 October I said this—

I mean, judges and magistrates don't actually have to go for re-election. They're there, appointed, they have tenure. They are there until the retiring age and I can't influence them and I don't try to influence them.

What I am saying to them though collectively, and some of them get it and some of them don't, but collectively I'm saying to them please listen to Queenslanders. It is interesting today because the Leader of the Opposition made a statement, and I understand the sense of it as this: that it is not for the government of the day to attack judges. That is very interesting. So I thought I would have a little look at the history of this. Yesterday I showed this one where it says—

Bligh siams judges as being out of touch.

I will move on to July 2007. In the *Australian*—

Minister Judy Spence yesterday expressed frustration that the courts were being lenient towards sex offenders

Ms Spence said she believed the court held a different view about allowing sex offenders into the community from the general public.

What did Peter Beattie say? He said—

Paedophiles are in a different category. Many of them are incurable.

I just say to everybody, whether it is police, courts, government or whatever, we have to be tougher when it comes to paedophiles.

It is very interesting. There was another case in 2006 in the *Courier-Mail*. What did Peter Beattie say then? Mr Beattie said more pressure should be placed on judges to hand down harsher sentences to dangerous criminals. But there is more. What did Prime Minister Kevin Rudd say in December 2007? In relation to a judgment and referring to a judge, the Prime Minister Kevin Rudd said he was horrified by her decision. He said—

I'm disgusted and appalled by the reports that I've seen in today's newspapers on this case,

But the final bit is very interesting. This is 30 January 2005—

A jailed sex predator will be set free tomorrow in a bureaucratic blunder that has the state government and a senior judge arguing over who's to blame.

It is about Justice George Fryberg. What did Attorney Rod Wellford say? He blasted Judge Fryberg's decision as nonsensical and said he would consider changing the law to prevent such an incident happening again. How interesting.

### Judges living in ivory towers: Newman

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CAMPBELL Newman has attacked Queensland's legal fraternity as "living in an ivory tower" in the wake of mounting criticism over laws passed last week to crack down on bikie gangs and recidivist sex offenders.

The Premier defended new legislation giving his government power to override a court's decision to release a sex offender and imposing mandatory sentences on gang members as a popularly backed response to a judicial system that was falling.

Mr Newman's comments were delivered as the Judicial Conference of Australia, which represents judges and magistrates, issued a statement raising concerns about both the laws.

Under the new legislation, the government has the power to make a "public-interest declaration" to indefinitely keep a convicted sex offender in jail if a court granted parole.

Under the anti-bikie laws, gang members face a minimum six months' jail for setting foot in their clubhouses and a mandatory 15 to 25 years' jail on top of the sentence they receive if they are convicted of serious crimes.

Judicial conference president Phillip McMurdo, a judge on Queensland's Supreme Court, said concerns about the sex offender law were

"understandable" because it, for the first time in Australia, challenged the power of the courts to impose a prison sentence based on the circumstances of the case.

"There are legal questions about the validity and extent of the powers which are given to the government under this act," he said. "In particular, there is a question of whether the act affects the independence, impartiality or integrity of those courts, including the High Court, in deciding whether to order the detention or release of a relevant offender."

Justice McMurdo said that, under the anti-bikie laws, a gang member could receive a mandatory 15 years' jail for an offence that normally "would not warrant imprisonment" because of their association with one of the 26 proscribed motorcycle clubs.

"A law which removes a court's discretion in punishing an offender is not on that account invalid," he said. "But mandatory sentencing laws are relatively unusual and can often be undesirable. Mandatory sentencing has the practical inevitability of arbitrary punishment, as offenders with quite different levels of culpability receive the same penalty."

Earlier in the day, Mr Newman said criticism from civil libertarians, the Law Society of Queensland and several retired judges did not reflect community sentiment. "They are living literally in an ivory tower," he said.

"They go home at night to their comfortable, well-appointed homes, they talk amongst themselves, they socialise together, they don't understand what my team and I understand, and that is Queenslanders have had enough."

Mr Newman also dismissed the premise of the separation of powers -- saying it was "more of an American thing", and that the parliament's decisions were "supreme". "The laws that were passed recently in parliament were passed by democratically elected people of this state and in 18 months' time, the people of this state get a chance to say, 'Well we didn't like those laws and we can get rid of them,'" he said.

# Qld Premier Campbell Newman, Attorney-General Jarrod Bleijie raise concerns about bail decisions for alleged bikies

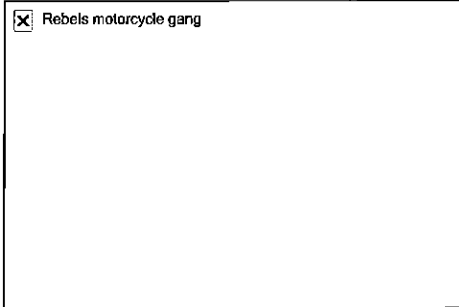


PHOTO: Police argued Campbell was a member of the Rebels bikie gang to keep him in locked up.(AAP)

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**Premier Campbell Newman says he is concerned by recent court decisions granting bail to alleged bikie members, despite new laws giving court officials the power to keep them locked up.**

Queensland police said last night they would challenge two court decisions that allowed alleged bikie gang members to be granted bail.

Attorney-General Jarrod Bleijie says he "respectfully" disagrees with the court decisions.

Lorne Campbell, 33, appeared in the Maroochydore Magistrates Court on Tuesday charged with breaching strict conditions relating to his place of address.

He had been on bail for extortion and firearm offences relating to a shotgun attack on a Sunshine Coast tattoo parlour in April.

Campbell appeared in court on Tuesday and police argued he was a member of the Rebels bikie gang to keep him in locked up.

But Magistrate Bernadette Callaghan was not satisfied that he was and granted Campbell bail.

The office of the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) says it will apply to the Supreme Court to review that decision.

## Bills passed by Qld Parliament

The DPP says it will also appeal another relating to bail granted to a 25-year alleged bikie member who appeared in the Holland Magistrates Court in Brisbane last week.

Mr Newman says he wants the Queensland judiciary to start realising what the community wants and act accordingly.

"To protect the community - that's all the Government is after [and] that is all the Queensland community is after," he said.

Mr Bleijie says the Government's new anti-bikie laws include a presumption against bail for alleged gang members.

"I really can't talk about that matter because we've now announced that we will be asking for a review of that [court] decision," he said.

"Police and the Office of DPP before the Supreme Court judge, so we respectfully disagree with that position.

"That's why we're going to be asking for a review to ensure that the laws are being interpreted as they were designed by the Parliament."

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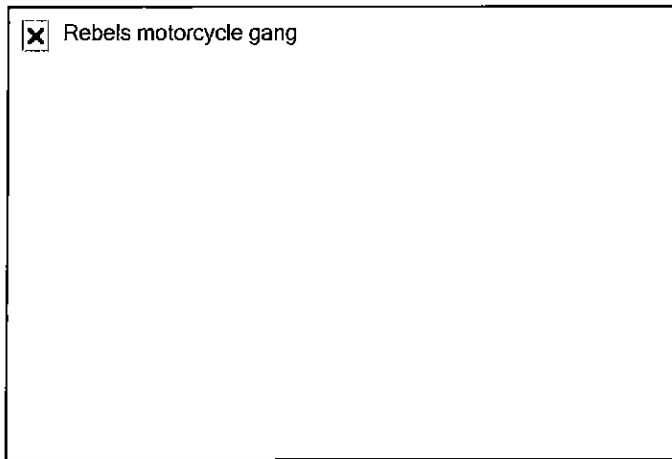
