Dear Rob

I am currently acting in the role of Information Champion for the Department of Justice and Attorney-General and write in relation to Christine Costley's email requesting Departments to provide DPC with fortnightly reports on some aspects of each Department's RTI operations. Unfortunately, I was unable to stay to the end of the IC meeting last week but I understand that a number of ICs raised concerns about this request.

I have reviewed the terms of the email and believe that in its current form, complying with the request would raise a number of issues, the single most important concern being the Department's obligations under the Information Privacy Act 2009. If you would like more detail about these matters please let me know and I will arrange for a short paper to be prepared on point.

However, I have had the attached draft reporting format developed for your consideration. This is a modified version of the JAG fortnightly report to the DG. You will note that names have been excluded. The terms of the applications are usually confined to a descriptor only -WHS (Workplace Health and Safety files), DEPT (General departmental information), COR (Coroners files) and DPP (DPP files) etc.

If the proposal is to proceed unaltered, then a letter should be sent to the Acting Director-General for his consideration.

In response - I make the following observations:

The QPS RTI&P Unit does prepare a list of applicants and due dates - however not the substance of the applications - for information of the Commissioner. In addition, this Unit prepares a separate list of sensitive/complex applications received from the media and/or particular applicants also for consideration by the Commissioner. I suspect the Commissioner briefs the Minister during his regular meetings of the matters we bring to his attention.

During the recent Information Champions meeting, many agency senior reps expressed their concerns that sharing information from agencies in the manner requested may be in breach of the privacy legislation. The applicants will have to be consulted with the advice that certain details of their applications will be forwarded to you and made available to other persons external to this agency. Following this meeting, I provided Christine samples of our list - it quite apparent from our discussion that there is no interest to include details concerning routine applications.

Whilst I accept that the proposed sharing of applicant's personal information and the nature of their applications is not intended to interfere with the independence of agencies to make determinations, there could/may be a perception that the independence has or will in fact been compromised.

For reasons outlined above, I am not supportive of the proposal.

However, it it is intended to proceed (with the proposal) in its current form, may I suggest that you formally forward your written request to

the Commissioner for consideration and await his advice.

Should you require further clarification, please do not hesitate to contact me direct.

We are continuing to receive a significant number of inquiries from agencies about operational issues relating to the administration of the RTI Act and the processing of applications under the Act. To a large extent, these queries have been motivated by agencies/decision-makers wanting to ensure that they are applying the Act as consistently and fairly as possible, and also because there seem to have been a number of applications in recent times that relate to information across a number of agencies, which raise important issues about coordination of government responses.

We appreciate that agencies require advice from us as quickly as possible to ensure that they are able to meet the required statutory timeframes or, in cases of proposed administrative release, to ensure that they are able to respond to requests for information from the public as quickly as possible.

To enable us to provide better and more timely advice to agencies, we are requesting that you provide a fortnightly list of current RTI applications for your agency (ie received and currently in progress).

Please note that we do not require that the list include applications for personal information (ie applications under the Information Privacy Act). The list will be used to assist us with responding to individual agency's queries and also to better coordinate cross-agency issues. Please note that this request for the information is not intended in any way to interfere with the decision-making processes of officers in agencies; rather, it is an information-gathering exercise aimed at ensuring that, as lead agency for the RTI legislation, we are better placed to assist agencies in addressing issues associated with the ongoing administration of the RTI Act.

We also appreciate that many of you already compile these types of reports for your agencies. If you do, then we are happy to accept these reports as the fortnightly report from your agency. If you don't, then the table below will hopefully assist as a template and an indication of the type of information we are seeking from agencies.

We are requesting that a fortnightly list containing the above information be provided by each agency by the Friday of each fortnight, commencing the week of 5 April (ie the first fortnightly report would be due by 4pm on Friday 16 April 2010). 
