I recently had the chance to brief your mines advisor, Mr Lance McCallum, on our plans to develop the rich rock phosphate deposits in north-west Queensland. The briefing was arranged by the local member for Mt Isa, Betty Kiernan, who has been involved with the project from its inception and remains a strong supporter.

Our publicly listed company, Legend International Holdings, is a mining and agriculture resource development company based in Melbourne, but principally focussed on developing the phosphate deposits in Queensland.

The deposits lie approximately 130kms north-west of Mt Isa on the margins of the Georgina Basin with historically proven commercial reserves in excess of 1 billion tonnes, averaging 16% phosphate content. Based on a phosphate rock price of \$200-\$250 per tonne, and an anticipated annual export rate of 5 million tonnes, this project has considerable employment and economic significance for the north-west region and Queensland as a whole.

Legend already holds exploration licences over approximately 5.2 million acres in Queensland and the Northern Territory and is presently seeking further tenements in high grade ore areas to enable additional drilling and metallurgical testing to commence in the third quarter of this year. # Update (since 2 June 2009) on Legend International Holdings Inc's Queensland Phosphate Project

- The D-Tree Project is a joint venture between Legend International Holdings Inc (80% and manager) and Mt Isa Metals Ltd (20%). The D-Tree DSO (Direct Shipping Ore) project proposes 0.5 million tonnes per year direct shipment of phosphate rock.
- Minister Robertson met with Mr Joseph Gutnick, President and CEO and Mr Craig Michael, Executive General Manager, Legend International Holdings Inc (Legend) on 17 June 2009.
- The project is being case managed through Queensland Mines and Energy, Department of Employment, Economic Development and Innovation, to expedite the processing of the tenures for this project as part of the 'Streamlining Projects' initiative. A Mount Isa based case manager has been appointed.
- The Department of Environment and Resource Management has assessed that no Environmental Impact Assessment (EIS) will be required for the D-Tree Mining Lease application 90190. The Environmental Authority for the mining lease will be assessed under an Environmental Management Plan (EMP).
- The company announced in May 2009 an Inferred Resource for the D-Tree deposit within EPM 14753 of 135 million tonnes at 13.8% P<sub>2</sub>0<sub>5</sub> (phosphate), using a cut-off grade of 10% P<sub>2</sub>0<sub>5</sub>.
- On 29 June 2009 the company announced an Inferred Resource for the D-Tree DSO Project of:

# RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that you:

- note that Mr Gutnick may seek your support to fast-track the Native Title approval process for its phosphate export project known as 'D-Tree', located near Mt Isa, and
- advise Mr Gutnick that the Government is unable to circumvent the statutory timeframe and claims process for Native Title associated with the D-Tree mining lease application.

### KEY ISSUES

- To commence the RTN process, the State must give notice in accordance with section 29 of the Native Title Act 1993. Minister Robertson has approved (by delegation) the section 29 Government Notice. The expected advertising and notification date is 29 July 2009, which will mark the commencement of a statutory four month public notification period to allow receipt and registration of any new Native Title claimants.
- The last Governor-In-Council signing date to grant a mining lease application is usually in early December of any given year. QME is alming to have D-Tree's mining lease application approved at this last signing date for 2009, however, any delays in the aforementioned processes will mean that this date will not be achieved.
