Hi Hamish,

I hope this finds you well.

I understand you were after early data about social housing demand in Toowoomba - while were gathering input from agencies for the covering brief on the Aimee McVeigh, QCOSS response about using Wellcamp to address demand in Toowoomba.

Social housing dwellings and need in Toowoomba (electorate data as at 30 June 2021)

The below will be a bit indicative: it's 30 June 2021 data and based on electorates. We imagine that the data that DCHDE provides for the QCOSS response brief will be based Housing Service Centre catchments and may be more recent, so expect to see different figures in the brief. Nevertheless, this should still provide a ballpark sense of demand for now:

Housing and Homelessness Action Plan (HHAP) 2021-25 build in Toowoomba

The HHAP includes commitments to commence 6,365 social homes statewide by 30 June 2025 under the Queensland Housing Investment Growth Initiative.

2,765 of these homes will be build under the QuickStarts Queensland capital program (traditional capital works). These homes have been allocated regionally. In the Darling Downs region, the Government has committed to commencing 100 new homes by 30 June 2025, with a total investment of \$32.5 million. At 30 June 2022, 31 of these homes have been commenced.

The additional 3,600 homes are to be delivered under the Housing Investment Fund, with location to be determined by the proposals the market brings to Government.

Social Housing Design Guidelines

I've also attached a copy of the social housing design guidelines. This is a publicly available document produced by DCHDE. We've come across it in responding to correspondence in the past. It's a really useful explainer of what the Queensland Government aims for when we are building social housing.

As the guidelines illustrate, the Government aims to deliver quality housing in quality locations that meet the needs of tenants and allow them to access and participate in the economy and community (connections to services, transport, work, education etc.). This ties in with the 'housing with support' approach that came up in your discussions at the Housing Service Centre and the stated objective of the Queensland Housing Strategy 2017 to 2027, that "every Queenslander has access to a safe, secure and affordable home that meets their needs and enables participation in the social and economic life of our prosperous state."

I trust this helps.


