In Queensland the Parliament has its own crest, as does the Legislative Assembly. I'm not sure MPs are actually restricted from using the Coat of Arms. There are restrictions on use of the corporate logo, which is the crest with Queensland Government printed underneath. The issue is whether we want to encourage such use. You will recall in Council that Opposition councillors regularly produced misinformation that was made seemingly more legitimate by the appearance of a Council logo. That being said, the Commonwealth has strict rules about the placement and use of its coat of arms, including hat it not be used alongside images of the flag or political party logos. The Queensland Parliament may have some rules mandating use of the Legislative Assembly crest on stationery it funds. I recall a decision some years ago to stop using the Parliamentary crest.
