| Minor and machinery in nature | <p>The proposal to exempt expiring subordinate legislation is machinery in nature.</p> <p>Under sections 56 and 56A of the <i>Statutory Instruments Act 1992</i>, statutory instruments may be exempted from automatic expiry if the empowering act is subject to review or replacement subordinate legislation is being drafted. Exempting relevant statutory instruments from expiry is an annual routine task of government.</p> <p>The proposal does not change regulatory policy or impose new impacts on business, government or the community. No further regulatory impact analysis is required under the Better Regulation Policy.</p> |
